NHS Direct

In the case of urgent need when the surgery is closed you can call NHS Direct on 111 to speak to a triage nurse. Your needs will be assessed, and advice offered or arrangements made for you to see a doctor.

Please do not ask to see a doctor out of hours unless you genuinely cannot wait until the surgery re-opens.

Call 999 in an emergency. Chest pains and/or shortness of breath constitute an emergency.

IMMUNISATIONS

RSV Immunisation

RSV is a common cause of coughs and colds. Most people get it several times during their life. It usually gets better by itself, but in some people (especially babies and older adults) it can cause illnesses such as: pneumonia or bronchiolitis.

The RSV vaccine is recommended if: you're pregnant – the vaccine is recommended during every pregnancy (from 28 weeks onwards) to help protect your baby after they're born & if you're aged 75 to 79

Childhood Immunisations

 1^{st} immunisations are due at 8, 12 & 16 weeks old. Boosters are due at 1 year and 3½ years old.

FLU Vaccinations

Eligible groups for the 2024 to 2025 season:

- Children aged 2 and 3 years
- those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
- pregnant women
- all those aged 65 years and over
- carers, those in receipt of carer's allowance or main carer of an older or disabled person
- · frontline health and social care staff

We will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Years Day. All other days we are open as usual.






















Services Available in the Surgery

- 7. Urinary tract infection (in women only)
